I do here appoint constitute and ordaine my beloved wife Deborah Lurid to be my sole executrix and only executrix to have and dispose of my estate as followeth, That is to say to John Lurid the elder some of Jehosaphat Lurid my brother I give fourscore poundes and to Jehosaphat his younge sonne I give forty poundes they being my nearest kinsmen and the chief supporters of the family, And the rest of my estate they being my next kinsmen and the chief supporters of the family, And the rest of my estate my money, belly, goods, bookes, clothes and whatsover I have or ought to have I give to my above named executrix my most lovinge wife Deborah Lurid and this is my last will and testament whereby I do abrogate all former made by me. I testify the same by setting my hand the day and date of these presents being the twentieth of September in the year of our Lord one thousand six hundred sixty eight year Christianus Lurid.

Memorandum that upon or about the fourteenth day of October Anno domini, 1638, Elizabeth Hinton late of Great Brittain within the gift of Saint Clements Church in the County of Middlesex having an intent to make and declare his last will and testament in writing in manner and form followinge, did will and bequeath as followeth or to the like effect vizt he did give and bequeath to our M^{rs} Mary Hunt tempore to buy, hire or assigne or apert of plate, Item he did give and bequeath to his sonne Gilbert Hinton beinge yett only child two hundred poundes to be paid unto him when hee shall attaine to the age of one and twenty years, And he did nominate and appoint Elizabeth Hinton his wife to be the sole executrix of this his last will and testament in writing, And all all things which he was of good and just memory and memory. In the name of god Amen this present third day of September in the fourteenth year of the reign of our Sovereign Lord Charles by the grace of God of England Scotland France and Ireland Kinge defender of the faith and in the year of our Lord god, 1638, I Henry Hedges of Winton in the parishes of Chertingham in the County of York, yoman beinge somewhat weak and sick in body but of good and just memory do make and ordaine this my last will and testament in manner and form followinge, In witness whereof I commit my soule into the hands of Almighty god my maker trustinge and believing by and through the merits of Jesus Christ my Lord and Saviour to obtaine full pardon and remission of all my sins and offences And my desire is that when my frendes shall be finished and ended that then my body may be buried in the parishes Church of Chertingham, And as for the temporall estate wherewith god of his mercy hath enriched me I dispose thereof as followeth, In witness whereof I give and bequeath to my sonne Henry Hedges the house wherein Gilbert Hedges dwelleth and all that good land, thre unto belonging, to hold to him and his assigned duringe all the termes of yeares therof yett to come if Edward Hedges my brother shall happen see longe to live, Except two acres of ground in a meade beinge parte of the said two yardlands beinge out yeares in a place called Westlynt and every other yeare in a meade called Whillade and the rest thereof

which said meadows, I give and bequeath to my said brother Richard he is to hold to my
and his assigns during the term of years that I shall give to hold to my
him, Item I give and bequeath to Margarett my second wife twenty shillings to buy her a ring.
Item I give and bequeath to my said second daughter my grandchild Anne he is to hold to my daughter
Susan Cartwright his wife twenty pounds and to their two children my grandchildren ten pounds
apiece which said money bequeathed to Robert Cartwright his wife and children I do will and
appoint to be paid within one year after my decease, Item I give and bequeath to my daughter
Katherine he is to hold to her hundred and fifty pounds to be paid to her at her age of twenty and one
year or day of marriage which shall first happen, And that she doth marry with the assent
of my executor and overseer hereafter named, Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary
he is to hold to her the like sum of four hundred and fifty pounds to be likewise paid to her at her age of
twenty and one year or day of marriage which shall first happen so that she doth marry to
the assent of my executor and overseer hereafter named, Item I give and bequeath to my daughter
Elizabeth he is to hold to her the like sum of four hundred and fifty pounds to be paid to her at her age of
twenty and one year or day of marriage which shall first happen, so that she doth also marry with the assent
of my said executor and overseer hereafter named, Item I give and bequeath to my daughter
Anne he is to hold to her the like sum of four hundred and fifty pounds to be paid to her at her age of
twenty and one year or day of marriage which shall first happen so that she doth likewise
marry with the assent of my said executor and overseer hereafter named, Item I give and bequeath
to my daughter Martha he is to hold to her the like sum of four hundred and fifty pounds to be likewise
paid to her at her age of twenty and one year or day of marriage which shall first happen so
that she doth likewise marry with the assent of my said executor and overseer hereafter named.
Item I give and bequeath to my youngest daughter Sarah he is to hold to her the sum of four hundred pounds
to be likewise paid to her when she shall attain to the age of twenty and one year or day of
marriage which shall first happen, And that she doth likewise bestow herself in marriage
with the assent of my executor and overseer hereafter named, And if it shall please god that
any of my said six daughters last named shall happen to decease before they shall attain
to their severall ages of twenty and one year or day of marriage then my will and desire is
that the survivors of my said six daughters shall have the portion and legacy of every of my
said six daughters which shall happen so to die and depart this life to be equally divided amongst
the survivors of my said six daughters last named, Item I give and bequeath towards the repair
of the parish church of Chrovenham four shillings, Item I give and bequeath to the poor
people inhabiting in Burdon twenty shillings the year during the term of three years next
following after my decease to be distributed amongst them at the discretion of my executor or overseer
hereafter named, Item I give and bequeath to the poor people inhabiting in Stanford twenty
shillings to be distributed amongst the neediest persons there, Item I give and bequeath to the poor
people inhabiting in Chrovenham twenty shillings to be distributed amongst the neediest people
there, Item all the rest of my goods and chattels not formerly bequeathed, I give and bequeath
to my loving wife Anne he is to hold to her whom I make ordain and appoint sole executrix of this my
last will and testament in writing her to take care in the educating and bringing up of my said
young children in virtue and godliness to bring them up in the fear of god and to take care
of them for their preferment in marriage, And my desire is and I do will and appoint that
my said wife with the benefit of my said childrens portions shall find and provide all things
necessary for my said six young daughters untill that they shall attain to their severall ages of
twenty and one year or day of marriage which shall first happen, Item I desire my loving son
in law Robert Cartwright and my former kinsman Thomas Stratton and my loving friends
Thomas Bull and William Hartwood to be overseers of this my last will and testament.

...bearing and embracing them that if any difference shall happen between my wife and children
 or between any of my said children to mediate and end between them of their own and I do likewise
 embrace them to be aydunge and assistance to my said executor that thid my will in all thinge may
 be performed according to my desire. Item to every of my said Executors I give ten shillinge Item if
 any of my said six daughters left named shall happen to dye before she or they shall attain to their
 severall ages of twenty and our years purnanted my will and intendment that their first pounde
 parts of £ or or their porsion by me to her or them intended shall be divided amongst the poor people
 of Barton and the rest of her or their porsion so happeninge to dye shall be divided equally amongst
 the Survivors of my said six younger daughters Item I give and bequeath to my brother William
 Wedged ten shillinge Item I give and bequeath to my sister Katharine Burty the porsion reserved
 in for forbeare of the forty pounde the worth to me. In witness whereof I have to this my
 said last will and testament sett my seale and to every shitt of parts of my said will sett my seale
 by makinge of marks. The marks of Henry Wedged, Witnes herunto, Thomas Stratton Robert
 Sadley Thomas Stramige, the marks of Richard Stramon.

 reason expectation in other I am putt in mynd of the transitory estate of manys life in this world, to avoid
 all contentions and questions that otherwise may happen concerninge that worldly estate wherewith god
 hath blessed me I do make and ordaine this my last will and testament in manner and forme followinge
 hereby also revokinge all former willy testaments legacies gifts and bequeste. by me at any tyme
 heretofore made given or bequeathid, Inpursuance of my soules into the hands of Allmightie god
 trustinge and assuringly expectinge a joyfull resurrection through the death and passion of Iesus
 Christ my eternall Saviour Item I give and bequeath the least of the Countie and Mannor of Coler
 with thappertunne in the County of North whereof I gave thirty years to some or thirt aboute
 unto my dearly beloved brother the right hon. Dudley lord North, To have and to hold unto him
 the said Dudley lord North and his assigned duringe for many years of the said term as he shall
 happen to live. And if he the said Dudley lord North shall happen to dye and dye this life before thend
 and expiration of the said lease then I give will and bequeath the residue remaunde and residue
 of the said term and all my estate and interest of and in the said Mannor and Countie of Coler
 with thappertunne which shall then remaine and be reserved at the tyme of the decease of the
 said Dudley lord North unto my lovinge Nephew Dr. Dudley North knight Sonne and heir
 apparent of the said lord North, To have and to hold to him the said Dr. Dudley North his assigned
 and assigned duringe all the residue of the said term. Item wherof I gave underwritten, three
 hundred poundes adrenture upon the newe yonge stock to the East Indies and have already
