The said Settlements and Covenants may appear I do hereby a-
 cording to the power by me reserved charge my Estate at Compton
 with the said sume of seven thousand pounds for the purposes a-
 foresaid and do direct that my Executor herein after named
 do levy and raise the said sume of seven thousand pounds as soon
 as may be after his wife is come to age and that she and M^{rs}
 Frances Gore her Mother and M^{rs} Mary Gore her grandmother
 shall have performed and executed their parts of the said marriage
 Settlement from I give and bequeath unto my said son William
 Hodges whom I make my sole Executor of this my last will
 and Testament all my Estate real and personal whatsoever
 upon this condition that my wife Jane Elmer Hodges may
 have and retain any part of my plate and household goods
 in any of my houses as she shall think fit for her own use in
 abstinence whereof I have herunto set my hand and seal this
 seventh day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand
 seven hundred and fourteen. Hodges. Signed sealed
