That we whose names are underwritten came present in the County of
 Middlesex London in the County of Berks. Just deceased within one week before his decease (who departed
 this life on the xxij day of June last past) being moved by his friends to declare his last will and
 Testament for the disposing of his estate he being then in perfect memory did publish and declare
 his will and Testament following to wit That he had no other friend in this world but his three brethren
 viz. Edward London of Buryon Esquire and that whosoever it should be Allmighty God
 to call him out of this world he did freely give and bequeath his whole estate unto his said three
 brethren the said London. And thus with us whose names are underwritten was and was ready
 to testify on this said date and day and yeare first above written. John Hobb. Esquire. Nathaniel
 Buller. Esquire. George Rowland.

 doe ordaine this my last will and Testament in manner and forme following. First I bequeath my
 soule unto Allmighty God desiring him to accept through for my blessed Saviour Christ Jesus sake
 who hath redeemed it. My body I desire to be buried in such decent manner as my beloved wife
 shall thinke fit. And as for my worldly goods I bequeath them as followeth. First I give

and bequeath to the poore of Bampton forty shillings and to the poore of Stracworth forty shillings
 and to the parish church there twenty shillings. And to my eldest daughter Anne hedge I give and bequeath one
 hundred and thirty pounds at the day of her marriage or if she be not married at the age of twenty one years
 Likewise I give and bequeath unto my daughter Rebecca the sum of one hundred and thirty pounds at the day
 of her marriage or at the age of twenty one years, which of them shall first happen, also to the third my wife
 now to be with I give and bequeath the sum of one hundred and thirty pounds also at the day of
 marriage or at the age of twenty one years which of them shall first happen. But if it shall please God
 that either of my said children shall die they or they being unmarried my will and desire is that the portion of
 such child or children so dying shall be equally divided between the surviving or if there be but one living, then
 all to her one living. But if it shall happen that they all die unmarried (as God forbid) then my will and desire
 is that my beloved wife shall dispose thereof as she shall see fit. And for all the rest of my estate and goods I
 give and bequeath unto my beloved wife and I will that my said Executors of that my wife will and Testament
 and my beloved brother Thomas hedge of Redbourne shall be the full hedge of Kingdome and Henry hedge
 of Redbourne gent. and William Lord of Bampton yeoman my Executors and for their power here
 in I give and bequeath unto one of them power of attorney in writing under the hand and seal of the said
 hedgees to sell my lands the day and year first written in William hedge, John hedge of the Stracworth
 hedgees Henry hedge, Joan hedge, William hedge

 In witness whereof I give and bequeath to the said George Booth of Durham Kn. the sum of two pounds ten shillings
 being here to buy a ring thereof with delicate work upon the ring and likewise to have written within it the
 gift of William Smithwick. Item I give and bequeath to Henry Wymonning of Curwinstone Esquire
 the sum of two pounds and ten shillings to buy a Ring as before said. Item I give and bequeath to my Cousin
 Mervell Wymonning of Henry Wymonning of Wymonning Esq. the sum of two pounds and ten shillings to buy
 a ring as before said. Item I give and bequeath to William Maudon of Chorlton Esq. the sum of five pounds
 to be bestowed upon some with my kinde my own house and a pair of shoes on either side the shoe.
 Item I give and bequeath to Mary Orling my kinswoman and spouse the sum of forty pounds. Item
 I give and bequeath to Thomas Mafford my servant the sum of thirty pounds. Item I give and bequeath
 to Richard Mafford my servant the sum of ten pounds. Item I give and bequeath to Rachel Boston and
 Alice Mafford her sister the sum of ten pounds a piece. Item I give and bequeath to Edward Gosling
 my servant the sum of eight pounds in his and full satisfaction of all reckoning and accounts between us
 and the said Edward Gosling. Item I give and bequeath to Thomas Smithwick my kinsman the sum
 of two pounds. Item I give and bequeath to Mr. Richard Mafford, Mr. Edward Gosling, Mr. Robert Edge,
 John Smith of Bampton the sum of twenty shillings a piece to be occupied there. Item I give and bequeath
